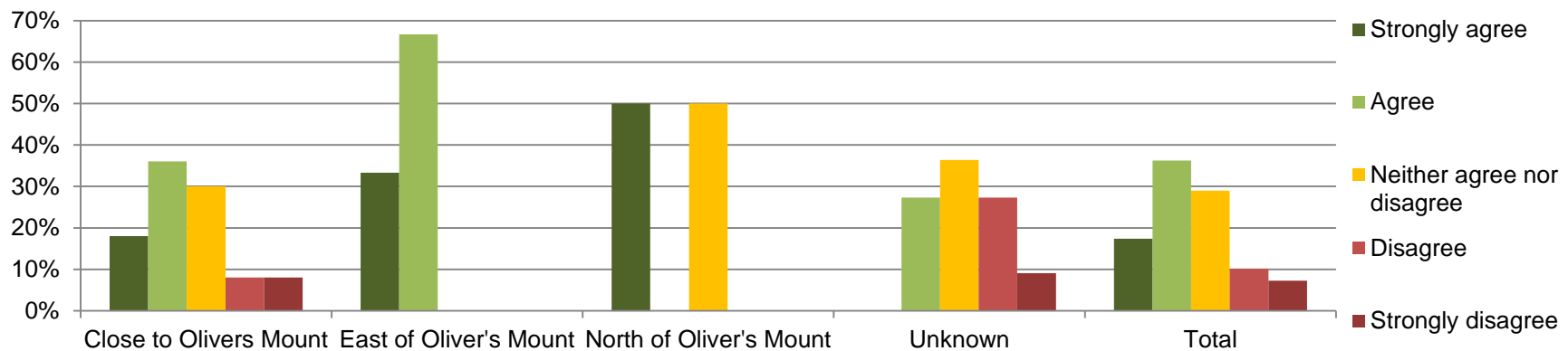

The noise mainly comes from the bikes where I live not the PA but it does not disturb us.	Close to Oliver's Mount

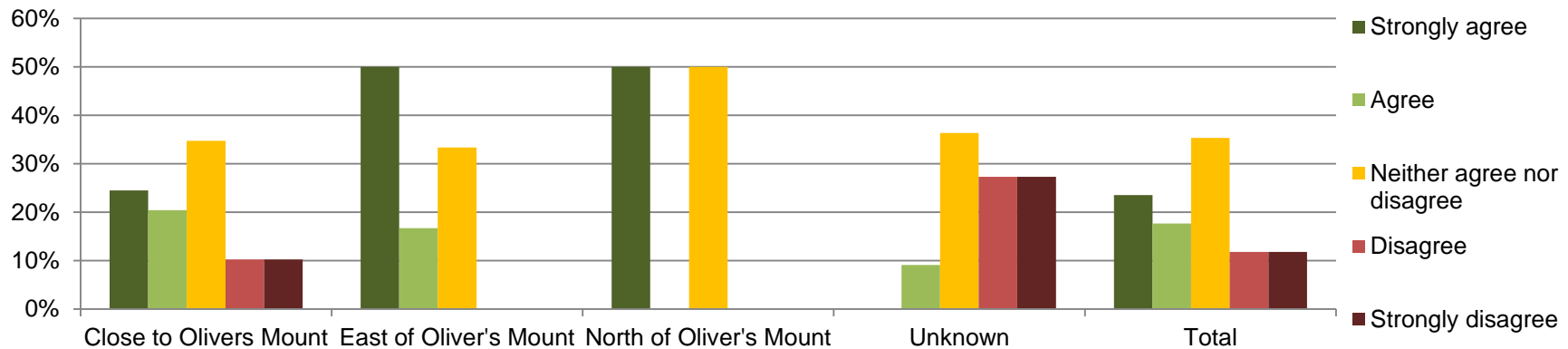

Several members have commented about the early closure of roads around the Mount, prior to eventing days.

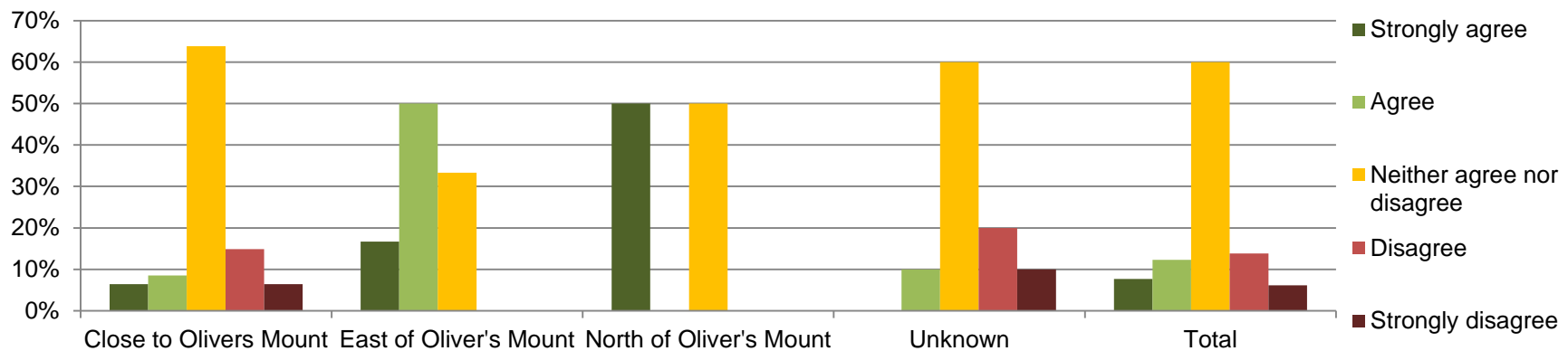
It would appear that roads on the Mount are closed earlier than the timings permitted and advertised, and this does cause inconvenience to residents and others who use those roads on a regular basis.
