Dear Alex

I am writing on behalf of Whitby Civic Society to comment on the Draft Business Plan for Scarborough Harbour.

Whitby Civic Society notes that your mission and vision set out ambitious goals for all the ports of the Borough. We share those ambitions and would welcome their translation into credible and achievable business plans for each port. We are therefore deeply disappointed that you have chosen to produce a business plan for one port only, and in particular that you do so at a time when there is such halting progress on restoring, and maintaining strengthening the piers which protect Whitby Harbour's very existence. We urge the Council to treat this as a rather more urgent priority than appears to be the case at present.

In developing the business plan for Whitby, we would like to see a strong emphasis on the economic and cultural benefits of heritage. We are keen to see our harbour thriving as a hub for skilled and high value coastal economic activity (which is why we have been so sympathetic to proposed developments such as the planned offshore servicing centre at Endeavour Wharf). At the same time this must be balanced with a robust and consistent approach to protecting Whitby's unique historic inheritance, which makes the town such an attractive place to live and visit.
